Over the last few months we have started auditing all the photographs. We have also been restructuring the physical archive so that specific groups of photographs are easier to search. For example, we have divided the High Street photographs into High Street North and High

Street South and also separated out the Jubilee Clock and the Pubs.

We are in the process of splitting Recreation into **Sports** – Cricket & Football etc and **General Recreation**. – Leisure Centre; Band & etc. and many other large groups of photographs into more manageable divisions so people don't have to trawl through too many photographs to find their area of interest.

Please note that we have also created an index for each of the sections about Maps; the Coins Grandad's Shed and The High Street photographs

The Maps index now has all the details of the places on the map, places of interest and names of all the Farms.

As we refine various areas we will be creating new indices to assist Volunteers in answering questions when they are on duty.
